I was in Washington, DC Thursday to meet with the Agricultural Trade Advisory Committees. The main focus of these meetings was the Trans-Pacific Partnership (TPP) negotiations now entering a critical phase. As many of you know, Japan has become a member of the TPP, raising the trade stakes substantially. Japan, however, is highly protectionist of its agricultural markets, and negotiations to open those markets have become strained. There is still no clear timeline to conclude the negotiations, but if progress is made, that will occur sometime next year. While in DC, I had the opportunity to contact former student Aaron Hobbs, who is President of RISE (Responsible Industry for a Sound Environment). He's doing well and hopes to get back to Aggieland for a visit, along with his wife, Nicole and two children.


