Team leader positions are available to undergraduates who have some university research experience as well as high interest in developing knowledge and skills for leading and mentoring a team of novice researchers who have little to no prior research experience.

BENEFITS – Through this mentoring program, you will gain:

Independent wage funding of \$9/hour for 10 hr/week for 10 weeks

RESPONSIBILITIES – As a participant, you will be expected to:

Attend a flexibly scheduled seminar or workshop (to be announced).

Effectively direct and manage a research team of at least three novice researchers for 10 weeks

Meet research expectations of faculty mentor

Complete and submit weekly program time sheets and participation surveys

QUALIFICATIONS – To be eligible, you must:

Have had some prior university-level or other professional research experience

Have good social skills and work well with others

Be able to obtain mentoring support from a faculty mentor

Be able to describe a particular summer research project agreed upon by you and faculty mentor Be able to recruit at least three novice undergraduates to participate on your research project

Completed registration and team application forms will be considered in order received. Acceptance will depend on satisfying above qualifications, agreeing to meet responsibilities, and funding availability.
