- Summer two open registration begins at 6:00 a.m., Monday, April 25 for all continuing students and ends at 5:00 p.m. on Tuesday, July 5. Late registration begins at 5:01 p.m. Tuesday, July 5 and ends at 5:00 p.m. on Monday, July 11.
- Fall open registration begins at 6:00 a.m., Monday, April 25 for all continuing students and closes at 5:00 p.m. on Wednesday, May 25 for undergraduate students only. 
