REGISTRATION REMINDERS

- ♦ Summer one and 10-week term open registration begins at 6:00 a.m., Monday, April 25 for all continuing students and ends at 5:00 p.m. on Friday, May 27. Late registration begins at 5:01 p.m. Friday, May 27 and ends at 5:00 p.m. on Friday, June 3.
- ♦ Summer two open registration begins at 6:00 a.m., Monday, April 25 for all continuing students and ends at 5:00 p.m. on Tuesday, July 5. Late registration begins at 5:01 p.m. Tuesday, July 5 and ends at 5:00 p.m. on Monday, July 11.
- ♦ Fall open registration begins at 6:00 a.m., Monday, April 25 for all continuing students and closes at 5:00 p.m. on Wednesday, May 25 for undergraduate students only. Open registration will resume at 8 a.m., Monday, August 8, 2016 through Friday, August 26 at 5 p.m. Late registration begins at 5:01 p.m. on Friday, August 26 and ends at 5:00 p.m. on Friday, September 2.
- ♦ Students with zero registered hours during the first four (4) class days of summer terms or the first five (5) class days of fall/spring semester will be assessed a \$100 late registration fee when they register.
