This week we will begin highlighting Study Abroad trips with features on Scotland, South Africa/Swaziland, Mongolia, Ghana and France. Thanks to Dusty Menzies who led the first ever Scotland program which is featured here today.

May 2016 marked the first AGEC Study Abroad – Scotland trip. Eleven students took part in the trip designed to study Scottish agribusinesses. After a couple of days seeing the sites in London, the group took a train to Aberdeen, on the North Sea coast. A tour of the Scottish Rural College and a boat ride on Loch Ness were fun, but the best part of the first week was probably the visits to the number one agribusiness in Scotland, whisky distilleries! The students enjoyed tours Glenfiddich and The Glen Livet distilleries.

The second part of the trip saw the group around Edinburgh. Between touring several castles (including a private tour of Castle Menzies!), climbing to Arthur's Seat in the middle of Edinburgh, and shopping on the Royal Mile, there was enough culture and history for everyone. The group was able to tour Scotbeef, a meat-packing facility and Netherton Angus, one of the top Aberdeen Angus producers in Scotland. They were also able to meet with Scottish lawyers, real estate experts, and livestock marketers at United Auctions in Stirling. One very interesting meeting was with Quality Meat Scotland, a marketing organization that takes Scottish check-off revenues and uses them to improve marketing and industry efficiencies. Their Scotch Assured Cattle and Sheep Scheme was definitely eye-opening. The final day of the trip saw the group attend ScotSheep, a Beef Cattle Shortcourse-type event with over 3,000 people in attendance. Between the sheep dog trials, shearing competitions, and handmade shepard's crooks, there was literally something for everyone.

The field trip was enjoyed by all participants and considering recent events was rather timely. Hearing first-hand how much Scotland Agriculture depends on E.U. subsidies was something unexpected for our students, but very useful in showing how agriculture is not the same everywhere as it is in America. All in all, it was a successful first trip (and everyone at least tried haggis!) and we cannot wait to go again in 2017! ~Dusty Menzies
