Responsibilities: Jones serves as district coordinator for the Financial And Risk Management (FARM) Assistance Program, a concentrated Extension effort developed to assist farmers and ranchers with strategic planning and risk management through individualized analysis. A FARM Assistance report is prepared by gathering data through a series of one-on-one meetings, and then performing a comprehensive financial analysis that evaluates operational cash position, debt levels, financial efficiency, and net worth. Many reports also involve the evaluation of alternative business plans, which often requires Jones to consult with specialists from other disciplines to provide additional details on these courses of action. To date Jones has completed 598 FARM Assistance analyses. These operations encompass over 2.55 million acres with a combined ending real net worth of \$1.83 billion. While conducting FARM Assistance, Jones realized that producers needed to learn better record-keeping practices. As a result, she developed curriculum and submitted grants to buy a computer lab that allows her to conduct QuickBooks Financial Accounting workshops throughout the state. When COVID-19 impacted her ability to teach live classes, Jones developed an online QuickBooks training course as well.

In addition to QuickBooks and FARM Assistance, Jones regularly presents educational programs at both the county and regional levels. She speaks a numerous producer meetings each year on topics ranging from farm financial management to commodity market outlooks to legislative updates and conservation programs. She also regularly collaborates with other specialists to conduct trainings and develop online decision aids for both producers and agricultural agents related to crop profitability, iPad apps and Farm Bill updating options. Furthermore, Jones works with commodity groups, other state and federal agencies and agribusinesses to create publications and manuals and promote the risk management initiative.

Responsibilities: While Jones' position has no official teaching appointment, she is always willing to fill in as an adjunct professor for West Texas A&M University during times of staff shortages or reduced class sizes due to COVID-19 regulations. Since 2010, Jones has taught multiple sections of food, fiber, and marketing and farm and ranch management courses. She also regularly contributes as a guest lecturer, discussing topics ranging from farm policy to financial management to writing in agriculture.
